Run a Race Towards God's Vision



Bishop Sue Hauptert-Johnson appointed me to Foundry UMC at this year's Annual Conference in June. This is the fifth year of our ministry together. God has blessed us and answered our Breakthrough Prayer. We have prayed that God would send children, youth, and young leaders. We now have active young leaders: Emily, Ericka, Eric, Colleen, Deborah, Dominique, and Taquila. A new family with three children came via this year's VBS and is considering joining the church. So, we are going to start a youth group this fall.

God also surprised us by bringing Coastal Montessori School to our Education Wing. We look forward to God's blessing as we add children and young families through the school. We pray that God uses us to plant the seed of Christ and his love into the hearts of children at Montessori.

In addition to children's ministry, God has strengthened our finances. We renovated the Education Wing to share the facility with Coastal Montessori School. The Food Pantry entrance door has been replaced with a new one. We have paid 100 percent of apportionments for both the District and the Conference. We have provided food for about 100-150 people each week through our Food Pantry mission. We have given out 150 homemade hot meals to needy neighbors every other week. Backpack supplies and students' social activity fund to Lynnhaven Elementary School, Welcoming Home Basket, Thanksgiving and Christmas Baskets, Angel Tree, Clothing Closet, and financial support to non-profit organizations are also our annual missions to build the kingdom of God in the city of Virginia Beach. We often say that we are small but mighty. Yes, indeed!

At the threshold of my fifth-year ministry together, I want to challenge us to run a race towards God's vision beyond our capacity. Look at Jesus' feeding five thousand people in the wilderness. The disciples evaluated the situation with practical reason. It was a wilderness, and there were more than five thousand hungry people. There was no way for the disciples to feed them with what they had-five loaves and two fish. However, Jesus' vision was bigger than the disciples'. Jesus told them to bring whatever they could share. When they brought a few loaves and a couple of fish, Jesus blessed, multiplied, and fed such a large crowd. Like the disciples, we may excuse ourselves for God's bigger vision for our church: "We are a small church, but we are already doing a mighty work. We do not have more time, energy, and resources to expand our ministry." Responding to our reasonable excuses, Jesus might ask us to see God's bigger vision and urges us to run a race towards it.

A Message from your Finance Chairperson

Dear Foundry Family and Friends,

It's been a busy spring and summer along with some exciting changes coming soon! First, I want to sincerely thank you for the ongoing support of our church – the giving of your time, talents, prayers and finances this year. All are vital to the general operations of our church and the many ministries and missions we support throughout the year.

We have completed all the renovation work in our Children's Wing for the arrival of the new Montessori School. An Open House took place on Monday, August 10, and children are expected to arrive by September 1. We are excited and look forward to partnering with this wonderful group!

A brief financial update: (1) we borrowed \$140,000 from our Bank in June to finance all the renovation work in the Children's Wing with the most expensive expenditure being a new roof. Monthly payments began in July, (2) a new Stewardship program is being discussed for 2027 to help with increasing general operating expenses and the new loan paydown, and (3) please continue to stay current with your financial giving to meet our ever-increasing operating expenses and our Methodist connectional obligations.

Second, below is a summary of our overall finances through July. We were blessed with some unexpected offerings in December 2025 which improved our opening cash position January 1. Our General Fund covers the normal operations and commitments of our church. Our Dedicated Funds are designated for specific ministries and missions of our church and not normal operations.

A Look Back on Missions Spring-Summer 2026

2026 has seen some changes in the calendar-year arrangement for some of our ministries. To help alleviate the “ministry fatigue” that can afflict the congregation when they are asked to contribute to too many ministries in too short a time span,

Welcome Home Baskets were moved up from their usual summertime slot to springtime. In March through April, we collected household items sufficient to build two baskets, which were given through the Judeo-Christian Outreach Center (JCOC) to individuals transitioning from homelessness to permanent housing. As usual, Foundry provided baskets with very nice items that these folks can be proud to use and display in their new homes. Additional monetary contributions in the amount sufficient to purchase another basket were donated directly to JCOC’s Welcome Home Basket Fund. Both baskets and money were received with tremendous appreciation.

In June, we prepared our last **JCOC Dinner** of 150 meals, completely cooked, boxed, packaged, and delivered to JCOC ready for distribution. Upon the opening of the new JCOC Betty D. Chidester Campus, we had a brand-new on-site kitchen and a shiny new dining hall to serve community dinners directly to our guests. We prepared our casseroles up to the point of cooking here at Foundry, then transported everything to the new facility, where we completed cooking, packed just 40 meals to go, and served the remainder cafeteria-style to dine-in guests. We were pleased to see how well our system transferred to the new facility, and JCOC personnel were impressed with our speed and efficiency. It was also nice to meet our guests face-to-face and receive their words of appreciation and thanks. Thanks to all of the volunteers and donors who make this happen.

To make purchasing food items more economical and convenient, we will ask the congregation to contribute money to the **JCOC Dinner Fund** rather than individuals donating food items. In addition to food we obtain from Operation Blessing, we can purchase our remaining ingredients in economy sizes and often order them online for delivery or pickup in the store parking lot. This has proved to be so much more efficient that we were sold on this new system the first time we tried it. We pray that the congregation will continue its much-appreciated support through cash donations going forward.

Summer is almost over, and our thoughts are turning to **The Great Foundry Apple Sale**. The sales campaign will run from September 20 through October 25. We will continue to use Dickie Brothers for some of our apples and Silver Creek and Seaman’s for the remainder. Ann’s Apple Butter will be offered, and since sweet potatoes were such a success last year, we will offer those, too.

Food Pantry continues to operate efficiently and cost-effectively, serving an average of 35-40 families per week. In addition to food provided by Operation Blessing and the Food Bank, Tom and Scott spend hours every week picking up food from Walmart and other commercial donor sites. The many hours required to run the Pantry each week are mind-boggling. A new refrigerator was recently donated by Food Bank.

Operation of the **Clothes Closet** has been taken over by Sarah Kyler, Cameron Melander, and Michele Jerome. They have been doing an energetic and impressive job of building new storage units, sorting, and hanging the huge inventory of donated clothing. Our Clothing Closet customers can choose from a large assortment of gently used, seasonally appropriate clothes for all ages.

This truly was a once-in-a-lifetime experience, and I know that I will return home different from the person who left. I am a stronger musician, more confident in myself, and even more grateful for the people who believe in me.

Most of all, thank you for being my church family and helping me experience an opportunity that I will remember for the rest of my life.

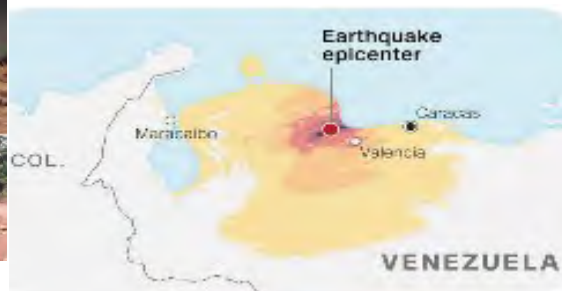

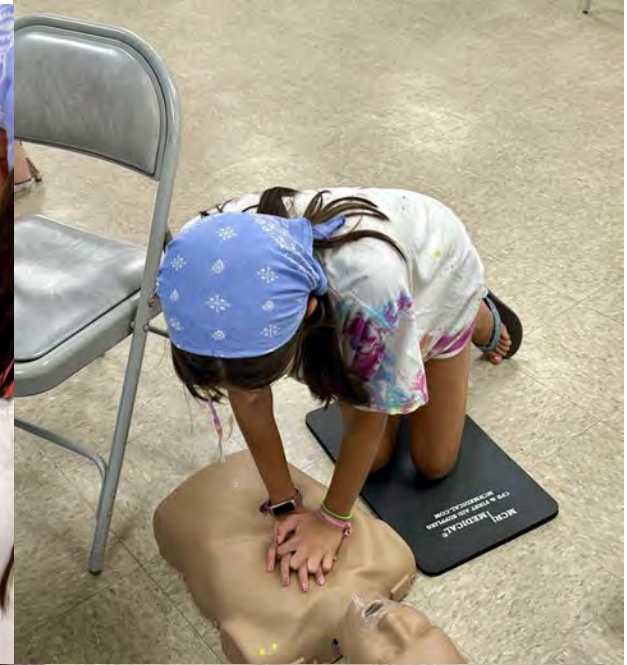
