Thanksgiving and Hospitality

What does Thanksgiving bring to your mind? Thanksgiving reminds me of hospitality and food. Twenty- five years ago I had my first Thanksgiving in the United States as a stranger. I was studying at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. Early in the morning, two days before Thanksgiving Day, I was driving to school. Unfortunately, my car stopped in the middle of the road. After taking care of my car, I emailed the professor whose class I had missed. The professor emailed back to me, asking how I was doing after the incident. Then, he warmly invited me to his family's Thanksgiving dinner. His invitation was God's gift enough to take away my stress and sadness from that morning's car problem. On the Thanksgiving Day, I was included as part of their family. I enjoyed their openness, love, and care as well as delicious food. It replaced my loneliness and filled my heart with gratitude.

Russian artist Rublev Andrei painted the Holy Trinity. It was created by the inspiration of the story of Abraham's hospitality to three strangers/angels in Genesis 18. Three angels sat in a circle around the Holy Communion table. The circle is not closed, but opens to outsiders. Paul says, "Extend hospitality to strangers (Romans 12:13)." How about expanding our hospitality to the outsiders by inviting strangers or lonely neighbors to our Thanksgiving dinner table?


Foundry Family and Friends,

Do you know... what is All Saints Day and why we celebrate it?

November 1st is All Saints Day! This ceremonial event is a day that we praise all the saints -- known & unknown! All Saints Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, or Hallowmas, is a Christian celebration in honor of all the saints from Christian history. In Western Christianity, it is observed on November 1st by the Roman Catholic Church, the Methodist Church, the Lutheran Church, and other Protestant denominations. The Eastern Orthodox Church and associated Eastern Catholic churches observe All Saints Day on the first Sunday following Pentecost.

The Christian festival of All Saints Day comes from a conviction that there is a spiritual connection between those in Heaven and on Earth. In Catholic tradition, the holiday honors all those who have passed on to the Kingdom of Heaven. It is a national holiday in numerous historically Catholic countries. In Methodist tradition, All Saints Day relates to giving God earnest gratitude for the lives and deaths of his saints, remembering those who were well-known and not. Additionally, individuals throughout Christian history are celebrated, such as Peter the Apostle and Charles Wesley, as well as people who have personally guided one to faith in Jesus, such as one's relative or friend.

The Bible doesn't teach us to pray to the saints, through the saints, or for saints. Rather, we remember the saints and to allow the testimony of their faith spur us on.

Do you know... what is World Communion Sunday and why do we celebrate it?

World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations. It offers congregations a distinctive opportunity to experience Holy Communion in the context of the global community of faith. The first Sunday of October has become a time when Christians in every culture break bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the Head of the Church. On that day, they remember that they are part of the whole body of believers. Whether shared in a grand cathedral, a mud hut, outside on a hilltop, in a meetinghouse, or in a storefront, Christians celebrate the communion liturgy in as many ways as there are congregations. It promotes Christian Unity. World Communion Sunday can be both a profound worship experience and a time for learning more about our wider community of faith.



This year at Foundry, we are asking the congregation to bring in culturally diverse breads to display on the altar. These breads will then be used for the social hour that follows the worship service that day.


