A Message from Your Pastor

Pray-Connect-Invite

We have walked with Jesus during Lent and Easter. Some of you experienced the risen Christ theologically and others encountered him spiritually while meditating on Jesus' life and ministry in John's gospel. Before Jesus was ascended to God the Father in heaven, Jesus commissioned the disciples: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20)."

Making disciples of Jesus Christ is the risen Christ's commandment to those who follow him. Last February, we installed an Evangelism Tree at the narthex. We are asked to pray, connect, and invite one person in a year. On Easter morning, we experienced the fruit of the evangelism tree. Ericka invited her friend Deborah and Fiona. Deborah invited her mom and brother. Fiona came to church with her little brother. Katherine invited her three grandchildren. They experienced Jesus and asked their parents: "Why don't we go to church? Why don't we pray?" On Easter, they asked their parents to come and worship with them. Their parents came to worship with their children.

Donna and Dan invited Nolan to the children's events for the last two years. On Easter morning, Nolan and his grandmother came to worship. His grandmother was touched by the Holy Spirit while listening to the sermon. She realized that both Nolan and she need Jesus and she decided to raise Nolan in a church. She promised that she would come to church on a regular basis.

Trig came to church for the first time with his grandparents who were visiting his family in Virginia Beach. I have sent a card and the flyers for children's events. Trig and his mother Lea came to worship a couple of times and on Easter morning his daddy and grandparents worshipped with us. In addition, a new family with two children came to church on Easter. They saw our Egg Hunt flyer through Lynnhaven Elementary School which is our partnership school in the city.

We have prayed our Breakthrough Prayer for about three years: "...Send children, youth, and young families..." We have made an effort to make disciples of Jesus Christ through prayers and outreach missions. God is doing something new for our church. Jesus promised in Matthew's gospel that he would be with us to the end of the world in our missional works to make disciples of Jesus Christ. I encourage my beloved Foundry family to continue to pray, connect, and invite one person to our church in 2025.

Food Pantry Update

Greetings to all. I'm grateful and happy to hear about so many activities around the church and the participation of many of you! Some include the Food Pantry, Children's ministry, Lent prayer time, JCOC meals, Men and Women's groups, Bible study, and more. A sincere thank you for your support and being a vital part of our Foundry church family.

I wanted to share some details around the one ministry I became involved with about three years ago – the Food Pantry. We have a wonderful and

committed group of volunteers who gather each week to prepare for and participate in providing a basic need to anyone who comes every Thursday mornings – various foods/groceries, clothes and now personal prayer.

Our patrons are various and numerous. Every week, we have single adults of all ages, couples, small and large families with children of all ages. Some children accompany their parents. Most people drive their own vehicles, some drive work vehicles and some get rides to our pantry. A few ride bikes or walk. We average 10 - 20 new families each month. And it's a very wide mix of personalities. All a welcome and are greeted with friendly smiles and words. We've also been blessed with having some of our patrons visit our church on Sunday mornings and others participate in our children's programs.


You can see by the numbers below how important it is to keep our pantry well stocked.

We purchase food each month at very reasonable costs from Operation Blessing in Chesapeake and from the regional Food Bank in Norfolk. And we receive food and monetary donations from our church family and other groups. Every dollar donated is wisely used to purchase the appropriate items needed by our patrons.

This is only a brief summary of what this important ministry is doing for our community. And again I thank you for your support and involvement in any of our church's ministries.

A Message from your Finance Chairperson



Dear Foundry Family and Friends,

I wanted to provide a brief update on our financial position for the first quarter of 2025. You may recall we had a formal Stewardship campaign last fall and received a total of 29 financial pledges totaling \$163,024. In addition, we historically had another 28 families who provided \$81,825 in financial support in 2024. This support, along with other expected receipts and God's help, will allow us to meet of our planned ministry budget for 2025.

As shown below, we have received actual offerings and other receipts of \$61,063 as compared to our expected offerings and receipts of \$69,212. Our shortfall of \$8,149 is most likely timing or some other temporary situation. It's important that each of us stays current with our planned support so that our church operations and ministry areas continue to thrive and help others.

The Food Pantry has been seeing increased numbers of families, and it is very likely that this trend will continue. We have reliable sources of food from Operation Blessing, Food Bank, and your generous donations of cash and food. We are also part of an informal consortium with other food ministries who give us their overflow or to whom we give ours - Community UMC has given us loads of food; we give our overflow to Thalia UMC or to The Gathering; we give our overabundance of bread and pizza to firefighters. What a great circle of giving and reciprocity in our larger community!

Sometimes, when we get a large food shipment in, it takes a lot of Tetrus-like problem-solving to figure out just where we're going to put it all! Just ask Tom Brabrand, who put out a plea for the donation of a freezer, new or used, to safely store our bounty. Enter Diana Fay Boyce, who approached East Coast Appliance for a donated freezer, and sure enough, they gave her one! The new chest freezer is a beauty - stop by and see it once it is installed in the Food Pantry space. Many thanks to Diana Fay and to Walt Hansbarger of the Military Highway branch of East Coast Appliance.













