A Message from Your Pastor

Perseverance in Prayer

Jesus in Luke's gospel teaches the disciples to pray persistently (11:5-13). He tells a story. Someone had a friend visiting at midnight, but he did not have anything to offer his friend. He went to a friend next door and asked him to lend him some bread. His friend replied inside: "Do not bother me. The door has already locked. My children are in bed with me. I cannot get up and give you anything." However, the friend who had a visiting friend never gave up and kept knocking on the door. A Message from your Finance Chairperson

Dear Foundry Family and Friends,

I wanted to provide an update on our church's financial position for the first half of this year.

As shown below, we have received actual General Fund offerings and other receipts of \$127,332 through June 30, as compared to actual expenditures of \$133,694. We have used funds from our savings account to cover the shortfall in offerings of (\$6,362). Our General Fund covers expenditures for our:

- 1) Church Facility (insurance, maintenance, utilities), 2) Administration, 3) Staff Salaries,
- 4) Worship Services, 5) Education, and 6) Virginia Methodist Conference.

Dedicated Fund offerings received through June 30 were \$11,504. Ministries we support throughout the year include our Food Pantry, Vacation Bible School, Children's Ministry, JCOC Dinners, Welcome Home Baskets, Backpack and School Supplies, Disaster Relief, Thanksgiving and Christmas Baskets, and other items.

Missions News Summer 2025



Creation Care - We kicked off the summer with a Sunday luncheon featuring a presentation by Emily Lomauro of Lynnhaven River Now. She explained the significance of the Lynnhaven in the ecosystem of the Chesapeake Bay and the importance of eco-friendly and sustainable practices in our homes and at Foundry.



Last fall, we conducted a major project on the church property which established a rain garden to manage the flooding in our Prayer Garden area; graded the Virginia Beach Blvd portion of the property to regain proper drainage of stormwater; and planted a beautiful collection of native trees which will support local wildlife and also drink a bunch of that stormwater.



Inside, we have discontinued the use of styrofoam products in the kitchen and are using LED lightbulbs, and recycling everything we can. These practices are earning us the designation of Pearl Faith Community - a symbol of Foundry's commitment to Creation Care.

Missions News Summer 2025

Food Pantry continues to operate weekly and to provide food to ever-growing numbers of families. From an average of 25 families per week a year ago, we are now serving and average of 35 families per week. This is an essential service to the public and Foundry's commitment through food and monetary donations and hours of person-power dedicated to picking up food from Operation Blessing, Food Bank, and other sources, unloading and repackaging food, and staffing the Food Pantry speaks to this church's dedication to our neighbors in need.







July was Welcome Home Baskets Month, when we collected household goods to provide formerly homeless people who have newly qualified for permanent housing with a nice start in equipping and furnishing their new homes. This ministry is especially appreciated by the recipients!

Enjoy the rest of your summer, but get ready for **The Great Foundry Apple Sale** beginning at the end of September. Make a personal effort to not only purchase apples for yourself, but to spread the word and sell apples to your friends, relatives, and neighbors. This is our annual fundraiser to raise money to support **Wings of Caring Aviation Ministry** in Democratic Republic of Congo. We help to provide lifesaving medical evacuation services in a Texas-sized country with poor infrastructure and few paved roads. 
