Take the Cross and Follow Me



Our Lenten journey began on Ash Wednesday,
February 22 this year by receiving ashes on our
forehead. In ancient times, repentance was
emphasized by wearing sackcloth and the covering
of oneself with ashes. Lent is a Christian season to

repent our sins and to live in the presence of God. It is a season to reorient our lives from the worldly interests to God, and God's will. The sermon series during Lent will be "Discipleship" from Mark's gospel.

Jesus called his disciples and taught them discipleship. The core of the discipleship is to take up our cross and follow Jesus to give life to the world. He said,

³⁴ After calling the crowd together with his disciples, Jesus said to them, "
All who want to come after me must say no to themselves, take up their cross, and follow me. ³⁵ All who want to save their lives will lose them. But all who lose their lives because of me and because of the good news will save them. ³⁶ Why would people gain the whole world but lose their lives?

(Mark 8:34-36, CEB).

During Lent, I would like to encourage the Foundry Family to read the gospel of Mark and reflect on discipleship and the cross. What is the cross that Jesus wants you to carry for the sake of your family's salvation and peace? What is the cross the Lord asks you to bear to revive our church? What is the cross he commands us to take to heal the world? In this holy season, I pray that we choose a cross in our daily lives to be a little light of love and hope both to our family and to the world while meditating on Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection for our salvation.


